- I. Capital Improvements

- II. Fee Schedule 21-22

- III. Dress Code – Hat Policy

- IV. Report of Activities

- V. Covid 19 Testing

- VI. Online Students Report
Mostly kids online have not been successful; if they choose to go online they can come back after the quarter; 9 kids currently online; if a student fails they are no longer given online option; online is not for week to week or class to class it is for the whole term (with a few exceptional situations)
- VII. Counseling
Working on scholarships and college preparing; working on videos for 8th grade parents to teach the options; 13 this year graduating with their generals; lots of students in college students; one next year graduating with Associates hasn't happened since 2009; more and more options for students and college classes
- VIII. Lisa information from Kanab City wanting to make an outdoor classroom for students to use as a stem or outdoor learning area. Lexie also worked on this with the Kane Schools Foundation. All present agreed that we as a council are in favor of this area.
- IX. Mariah brought up the need for a crosswalk from KHS across HWY 89 by the fire department. All the principals have talked to Chief Cram and UDOT to make this change.
