January 14, 2020 minutes

Trevor Stewart called the meeting to order at 12:00. Members present included April Riddle, Lexie Little, Abby Orton, Chad Castagno, and Jennifer Yates. Members absent included Kacie Troy, Lisa Church, and Angie Reidhead.

Trevor Stewart began the meeting by discussing the items on the January calendar. Focusing on the region drill team being held at Kanab High this Friday night. He also explained the reason for Parowan's boys basketball games to be switched locations. There were no questions about upcoming events.

Chad Castagno discussed the current enrollment of students in college classes. Currently students at KHS are enrolled in 265 college credit hours. In fall of 2018, which is the last data kept on this status, students were enrolled in 95 college credit hours.
