Report from SBP, Haylie:

Counseling

Mr. Castagno reported that during College Application Week, 145 school applications were submitted by Seniors.

Last year, 102 kids took college classes, there were 7 Associate Degrees earned, 12 students met their General Education requirements, and 76 students participated in Career and Tech Classes!
